NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

About NSS:

The National Service Scheme (NSS) is a Central Sector Scheme of the Government of India, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports. It provides an opportunity to the student youth of Technical Institutions, Graduate & Post Graduate at colleges and University level of India to take part in various government-led community service activities & programs. The sole aim of the NSS is to provide hands-on experience to young students in delivering community service.

NSS was formally launched in the country on 24th September 1969. This day is observed as NSS Day throughout the country.

NSS unit was established in Chandigarh Engineering in the year 2003.

The objectives of NSS:

The overall objective of NSS is Personality Development through community service. The broad objectives of NSS are to:

- Understand the community in which they work.
- Understand themselves in relation to their community.
- Identify the needs and problems of the community and involve them in the problem-solving process.
- Develop among themselves a sense of social and civic responsibility.
- Utilize their knowledge in finding practical solutions to individual and community problems.
- Develop competence required for group living and sharing of responsibilities.
- Gain skills in mobilizing community participation.
- Acquire leadership qualities and a democratic attitude.
- Develop the capacity to meet emergencies and natural disasters.
- Practice national integration and social harmony.

Motto:

The motto or watchword of the NSS is “Not me but you”. It underlines that the welfare of an individual is ultimately dependent on the welfare of society as a whole. This expresses the essence of democratic living and upholds the need for selfless service and appreciation of the other man’s point of view and also a consideration for fellow human beings.

NSS Logo:

The symbol of the National Service Scheme has been based on the Giant Rath Wheel of the world-famous Konark Sun Temple of Orissa, India. These giant wheels of the sun temple portray the cycles of creation, preservation, and release and signify the movement in life across time and space. The design of the symbol, a simplified form of the Sun Chariot wheel primarily depicts movement. The wheel signifies the progressive cycle of life. It stands for continuity as well as change and implies the continuous striving of NSS for social transformation and enlistment.

A NSS volunteer who takes part in the community service program would either be a college-level or a senior secondary-level student. Being an active member these student volunteers would have the exposure and experience to be the following:





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which is on course to recover within four decades. The phase-out of approximately 99% of the prohibited ozone-depleting compounds is confirmed in the quadrennial assessment report of the UN-backed Scientific Assessment Panel to the Montreal Protocol on Ozone Depleting compounds. Thus, the Montreal Protocol has been successful in protecting the ozone layer, resulting in a noticeable recovery of the ozone layer in the high stratosphere and a reduction in the amount of ultraviolet (UV) radiation that humans are exposed to. If present policies are followed, it is anticipated that the ozone layer will return to 1980 levels (before the ozone hole appeared) by 2066 over the Antarctic, 2045 over the Arctic, and 2040 for the rest of the planet. Particularly between 2019 and 2021, changes in the Antarctic ozone hole's extent were mostly caused by weather. But since 2000, the size and depth of the Antarctic ozone hole have been gradually increasing.

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





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
